CMD Special Grants Advice for Clergy

- 1. The CMD Grants Panel considers grants for larger sums. Clergy are invited to apply for these by sending a letter to Revd Canon Dr Alan Bartlett, Cuthbert House, Stonebridge, Durham, DH1 3RY or email alan.bartlett@durham.anglican.org which can be forwarded to the panel.
- 2. It is <u>always</u> worth having a conversation with Alan before submitting the formal application. His phone number is 0191 374 6012 or 07384 214 576.
- 3. The letter of application should be written in such a way as to clarify for the lay and clergy of the panel the following points:
 - (i) The applicant's current post and length of service.
 - (ii) The venture being undertaken.
 - (iii) The total cost of the venture.
 - (iv) A specific sum which is being sought as a grant.
 - (v) An indication of any other grants being applied for or which have been secured.
 - (vi) The reasoning behind the venture, including an indication of any discernment process or advice that has been received.
 - (vii) An indication of the kind of outcomes that are hoped for.
 - (viii) Something personal that helps the panel to feel that this really is a 'special grant', something which shows a sense of passion for the venture or connects it with a long-held hope or desire or specialist ministry.
 - (ix) An assurance that appropriate permissions have been received when the venture will occupy significant periods of time.
 - (x) An undertaking to report back on the value of the enterprise and to produce, if requested, something to be used to encourage others to take their ministerial development seriously.
 - (xi) Please state what motivated you to apply for a Special CMD Grant.
- 4. The panel may wish to consult the relevant Archdeacon before awarding a grant, but do not require references or testimonials with the letter of application.
- 5. The scheme is administered by Alan, responsible to the Revd Canon Libby Wilkinson, Director of Mission, Discipleship and Ministry.
